CLARA HALE

Clara Hale's father died when she was a baby, leaving her mother to raise her and four siblings. Clara was greatly influenced by the love and support of her mother and the importance she placed on being a good parent. She was also motivated by her strong moral upbringing in the Baptist church and her education. When Clara's own husband died, leaving her with two children to support during the Great Depression, she began a home daycare and later became a foster parent. Ultimately, this decision led to the creation of Hale House, a home for unwanted children and for children who were born addicted to drugs. In 1984 President Ronald Reagan called her an "American Hero." During her lifetime, Clara helped over 1,000 babies and children.

Rev. Francois is a 2009 Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Morehouse College with a Bachelor of Arts in History and Religion. Due to his stellar academic record, various other honor societies inducted Francois into their ranks, Phi Alpha Theta International History Honor Society, the National Society of Collegiate Scholars, Golden Key International Honor Society and The Fund For Theological Education Fellows (Undergraduate and Ministry) to enumerate a few. At Morehouse, he served as the president of the Martin Luther King Jr. International Chapel Assistants program for two years and was named the 2009 Martin Luther King Jr. Scholar. He is currently engaged in a Master of Divinity program at Harvard University's Divinity School. Francois is a proud member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated.

He was licensed and ordained at the First Union Baptist Church of Galveston, Texas. Under the mentorship and pastorate of The Rev. Dr. Marcus D. Cosby, he is currently a member of the Wheeler Avenue Baptist Church of Houston, Texas where he engaged in two highly structured pastoral internships. Like his current position at the Morningstar Baptist Church (of Mattapan, MA), Willie held ministerial internship position at the First Corinthian Baptist Church of New York City (Harlem) under the supervision of The Reverend Michael Walrond during the summer of 2010.

Living out his commitment to the life of the mind, in 2009, Francois co-founded the Preacher as Scholar Association, Incorporated (PASA), a nonprofit organization committed to the convergence of intellectualism and spirituality in the ministerial exploits of young ministers—seminarians and pastors—as they aim to provide service to the greater community through on the ground reform in the education system. Francois has been published by the African American Pulpit Journal and is a 2010 and 2011 Guest Contributor to the African American Lectionary. Honing his skills as an aspiring scholar of religion, Francois works as a research assistant for Dr. Jonathan L Walton, Professor of African American Religion at Harvard Divinity School. He also serves on the Young Preachers Leadership Board of the Academy of Preachers.

- 4- Click onto 'everyday green'
- 5- Enter the information exactly as it is on your PSE&G bill.
- 6- Enter your Point of Distribution # or PoD. This is the number on your bill that starts with PE and has eighteen digits after it. Do not enter the number group that begins with PG, as this is the gas portion of the bill.

Viridian does **not** have any contracts or fees, they provide 20% renewable energy to the electrical grid, which then supplies it to your home or business. For every family or business that signs onto Viridian, the Church will earn a residual \$2.00 per electrical meter, per month as long as that customer remains a customer of Viridian.
