HENRY OSSAWA TANNER

Henry Ossawa Tanner was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, the son of a well-educated minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church. Although his parents did not favor his artistic pursuits at first, they eventually supported him. Tanner began his formal training at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, where he studied human anatomy and learned how to transfer that knowledge to canvas. Tanner favored a realistic style and especially wanted to treat his African American subjects with dignity. Unable to support himself with his artwork in the United States, Tanner moved to Paris, where he studied with many well-known artists, and his work grew in popularity. He is best known for his painting, *The Banjo Lesson*, as well as for his many biblical subjects. His *Sand Dunes at Sunset*, *Atlantic City* was the first work by an African American painter to be acquired for the art collection of the White House in Washington, D.C.

*WELCOME.....*Honorable Cory A. Booker, Mayor

City of Newark

The Honorable Cory A. Booker, 41, is the Mayor of Newark, New Jersey. He took the oath of office as Mayor of New Jersey's largest city on July 1, 2006 following a sweeping electoral victory and was re-elected to a second term on May 11, 2010.

Elected with a clear mandate for change, Mayor Booker has begun work on realizing a bold vision for the city. Newark's mission is to set a national standard for urban transformation by marshalling its resources to achieve security, economic abundance and an environment that is nurturing and empowering for individuals and families.

Mayor Booker and his Administration have made meaningful strides towards achieving the City's mission. As of July 1, 2008, Newark, New Jersey led the nation among large cities for reductions in shootings and murders, achieving decreases of more than 40% reductions in both categories. Radical transformation of the Newark Police Department under Mayor Booker's leadership, together with the deployment of over 100 surveillance cameras throughout City, has led to Newark setting the nationwide pace for crime reduction.

Among other recent notable achievements under Mayor Booker's leadership, the City of Newark has committed to a \$40 million transformation of the City's parks and playgrounds through a ground-breaking public/private partnership. The Booker Administration has also doubled affordable housing production.

Mayor Booker has always been a champion and advocate for education reform for the children of Newark, N.J. This vision and passion for improving education for Newark children lead the largest unprecedented partnership with Facebook Founder and CEO Mark Zuckerberg.

Honorable Cory A. Booker, Mayor

On September 24, 2010, Mayor Booker launched the Partnership for Education in Newark, a significant commitment to improve public education by measurably improving academic achievement and rewarding academic success. Mark Zuckerberg contributed a \$100 million dollars to improve student success and champion great teachers. Mayor Booker believes that investing in educational excellence today will create the foundation for Newark's prosperity and competitiveness in the decades ahead. Mayor Booker envisions this incredible investment and the steadfast commitment of Newark's school leaders and teachers to improve youth outcomes will be the pathway to nationwide public education excellence; thereby, leaving an indelible imprint on education reform starting in Newark, N.J.

Mayor Booker's political career began in 1998, after serving as Staff Attorney for the Urban Justice Center in Newark. He rose to prominence as Newark's Central Ward Councilman. During his four years of service from 1998-2002, then-Councilman Booker earned a reputation as a leader with innovative ideas and bold actions, from increasing security in public housing to building new playgrounds. This work was the foundation for his leadership as Mayor. For this work, he has been recognized in numerous publications, including, among others, Time, Esquire, New Jersey Monthly (naming him as one of New Jersey's top 40 under 40), Black Enterprise (naming him to the Hot List, America's Most Powerful Players under 40) and The New York Times Magazine.

Reflecting his commitment to education, Mayor Booker is a member of numerous boards and advisory committees including Democrats for Education Reform, Columbia University Teachers' College Board of Trustees and the Black Alliance for Educational Options. Mayor Booker received his B. A. and M. A. from Stanford University, a B. A. in Modern History at Oxford University as a Rhodes Scholar, and completed his law degree at Yale University.

At the next screen, click on the statement "***to give on line if you are a member, please click here***"; you will be directed to a page that reads: *MOBC – Access ACS*. On this screen click on the statement that reads "Need a log in? ***Click here***". (Do not log in at this screen)

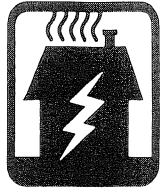
You will be directed to a screen that asks you to enter your e-mail address and name. Complete this information as directed. Once the system finds your name in the database, an email will be sent to your email address with your log in info and a temporary pass code.

After receipt of your log in info please go back and log in using your log in name and temporary pass code. (Note: log in using all the temporary pass code characters as you see them or cut and paste). You will be prompted to change your password after successful log in.

After you have successfully entered into the Access ACS database go to "***my giving history***", there is a tab that has your *PDF Tax Statement for 2010*.

Church is offering an exciting and innovative way to raise funds. We have joined forces with *Viridian Energy*, a Connecticut based energy company that provides 20% and 100% green energy at a discounted rate to the end line customer. Although

Viridian is the supplier of energy, **PSE&G will still be the utility that sends the bill, performs maintenance, emergency calls, etc.** To switch over to Viridian just follow these instructions:

- 1- Log onto our website at www.viridian.com/mobchackensack
- 2- Click on 'Become a customer'
- 3- Enter your zip code.
- 4- Click onto 'everyday green'
- 5- Enter the information exactly as it is on your PSE&G bill.
- 6- Enter your Point of Distribution # or PoD. This is the number on your bill that **starts with PE and has eighteen digits after it.** Do not enter the number group that begins with PG, as this is the gas portion of the bill.

Viridian does **not** have any contracts or fees, they provide 20% renewable energy to the electrical grid, which then supplies it to your home or business. For every family or business that signs onto Viridian, the Church will earn a residual \$2.00 per electrical meter, per month as long as that customer remains a customer of Viridian.

As a supporter of the Church, every time you pay your bill the Church will earn residual income - additionally if you know of anyone who would like to save on their electrical bill and help the Church, we encourage you to speak with family and friends to convert to Viridian on the Church's Viridian website (viridian.com/mobchackensack).
