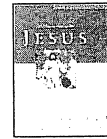

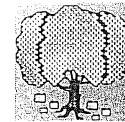

Alzheimer's takes an emotional toll on those with the disease, and their caregivers. If you or a loved one has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's, you are not alone.

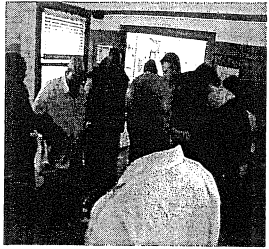
