

October is Breast Cancer

Awareness Month...an annual campaign to increase awareness of the disease. While most people are aware of breast cancer, many forget to take the steps to have a plan to detect the disease in its early stages and encourage others to do the same.

- One in eight women will be <u>diagnosed</u> with breast cancer in their lifetime. (Each year it is estimated that over 220,000 women in the United States will be diagnosed.)
- Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed and the second leading cause of death among women. (More than 40,000 will die.)
- Although <u>breast cancer in men</u> is rare, an estimated 2,150 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer and approximately 410 will die each year.

The best way to fight breast cancer is to have a plan that helps you detect the disease in its early stages. Create your Early Detection Plan to receive reminders to do breast self-exams, and schedule your clinical breast exams and mammograms based on your age and health history.
